The first originall and ground whereof, if a man would fearch out by the ancient Fathers, hee shall finde that the fame was not ordained, but of a good purpose, and for a great advancement of godlineffe. For they fo ordered the matter, that the whole Bible (or the greatest part thereof) should be read oner once enery yeere, intending thereby that the Clergie, and fpecially fuch as were Ministers of the Congregazion, flould (by often reading and meditation of Gods word) be flured up to godfineffe themselues, and be more able to exhort others by wholesome doctrine, and to confute them that were aduerfaries to the truch. And further that the people by daily hearing of hely Scripture read in § Churchshould centinually profite more and more in the knowledge of God, and bee the more inflained with the lone of his true Religion. But these many yeeres parfied, this godly and decent order of the ancient Rathers fath bin to altered, broken, and neglected, by planting in uncertain ftories, legends, responds, verfes , vaine repetitions, commemorations, nodals, that commonly when any booke of the Bible was begun, before three or foure Chapters were read out all the rest were vnread. And in this fort the booke of Efay was begun in Adnest, and the booke of Genefis in Septuagelima: but they were onely begun, and neuer read thorow. After like fort were other bookes of holy Scripture vfed. And moreover, whereas S. Paul would have fuch language spoken to the people in the Church as they might understand, and have profit by hearing the same; the service in this Church of England (thefe many yeeres) hath beene read in Latine to the people, which they understand not: so that they have heard with their cares onely, and their heart, spirit and minde have not beene edified thereby. And farthermore, not with flanding that the anci-
